

DOST- ITDI aligns 2024 targets to six-year science plan

Holds pre-planning workshop for 11 divisions

Dr Zorayda V. Ang, DOST-ITDI Deputy Director for Administrative and Technical Services, led representatives of the research, administrative, and technical services divisions in aligning their 2024 targets to the DOST Strategic Plan 2023-2028 during a pre-planning workshop series held on October 9, 10, and 12, 2023.

Draft of the department's six-year science plan encompasses "... refocused programs to align with the socio economic agenda of the President," Secretary Renato Solidum, Jr. said in an earlier interview. This includes DOST's priority programs as follows: (1) job creation/regional development through science, technology, and innovation (STI); (2) food security; (3) health security; (4) water security and environmental protection; (5) energy security; (6) transportation system; (7) climate and disaster resilience; (8) human resource development; (9) facility upgrading; (10) digital transformation; and (11) smart and sustainable cities and communities.

Further, these programs are supported by four DOST Pillars, namely promotion of human well-being, wealth creation, wealth protection, and sustainability. A fifth on governance was recently added to re-compose the DOST Pillars into five.

In a conscious effort, DOST also drafted the plan to thread through the Philippine Development Plan's goals to reinvigorate job creation, accelerate poverty reduction through a high-growth economy, and effect economic and "... social transformation for a prosperous, inclusive, and resilient society."





Thus, following the draft DOST strategy plan, Dr. Ang and representatives of 11 Divisions reviewed the Institute's targets and accomplishments to check if these are anchored to the five DOST Pillars.

A series of high dynamic consultation sessions were held on October 9 for ADM, FMD, and PMISD; October 10 for the Technical Services Group; and October 12 for the R&D Group to smoothly effect the objectives of the workshop. These sessions resulted in revised divisional roadmaps that are also aligned with the 10-point agenda of the current administration.

In one of her statements, Dr. Ang expressed her satisfaction in the collective efforts of the 11 Divisions which "... is a typical example of a unified, collectively dedicated unit" that is hoped to pave the way for a future where innovation as a strategy will promote wellbeing, wealth creation and protection for national development that is sustainable.
